Online violence against female journalists in focus at OSCE PA-RFoM webinar



The OSCE PA and the Office of the OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media (RFoM) held a joint webinar on 7 June, bringing together a diverse group of parliamentarians, diplomats and civil society from the OSCE region for a discussion of the role national parliaments can play in monitoring and combating online violence against female journalists and politicians.

OSCE Representative on Freedom of the Media Teresa Ribeiro welcomed participants, stressing the importance of collective action in tackling gender-based online attacks against journalists. She also previewed a new tool being developed by her office for monitoring online violence against female journalists. The Guidelines for Monitoring Online Violence Against Female Journalists will help to detect, predict and ultimately prevent the escalation of online violence against women journalists, Ribeiro said.

OSCE PA Special Representative on Gender Issues Hedy Fry (Canada) highlighted the role of parliamentarians to ensure that journalists are able to inform the public, and to do so safely. Parliaments, she said, can also help the public gain a better understanding of online violence against women journalists, including by promoting the collection of data on internet-based violence.

Third Committee Johan Büser spoke about the importance of countering online violence against women from a human rights perspective and emphasized the value of the OSCE PA as an international parliamentary forum in addressing the issue. Senior Research Fellow at the Department of Computer Science at the University of Sheffield Diana Maynard presented the OSCE Guidelines for Monitoring Online Violence Against Female Journalists, followed by a brief discussion with participants.

President Cederfelt meets with Albanian Speaker and colleagues at Swedish Parliament

OSCE PA President Margareta Cederfelt met Monday with the President of the Albanian Parliament, Lindita Nikolla, who was accompanied by the President of the Law Commission Klotilda Bushka and Vice-President Dhurata Çupi. The sides exchanged views on the progress of Albania's electoral reform and implementation of OSCE/ODIHR recommendations, and discussed Tirana's co-operation with the OSCE, including through its engagement with the OSCE Presence in Albania. Cederfelt welcomed Albania's reform efforts, as well as its efforts fighting corruption and organized crime.

They also discussed developments in the Western Balkans, stressing the need to guarantee the future of security and peace in the region. The Russian Federation's war against Ukraine was



also a subject of discussion, with President Cederfelt underlining the importance of the OSCE, international organizations and the international community supporting Ukraine's defence.
