## ADDRESS BY H.E. MR. ZANDAAKHUU ENKHBOLD, CHAIRMAN OF THE STATE GREAT HURAL (PARLIAMENT) OF MONGOLIA, AT THE OPENING OF THE 2015 OSCE PARLIAMENTARY ASSEMBLY AUTUMN MEETING

Your Excellency Mr.Ilkha Kanerva, the president of OSCE PA, Mr. President of Mongolia Elbegdorj Honorable Parliamentarians and Delegates, Honourable members of the Mongolian government, Ladies and Gentleman,

First of all, on behalf of the Parliament of Mongolia, I like to extend my sincere greetings to all guests and delegates of the Autumn meeting of the OSCE PA.

Three years ago, Mongolia became a full member of the OSCE, which was established upon the principles of the Helsinki Final Act of 1975. We are pleased to host the 2015 Autumn meeting for the first time not only in the country but also in the whole region, and I am delighted to remind the participating delegates that Mongolia will host 2016 ASEM summit.

The main objectives of the OSCE PA are to increase the involvement of parliaments and parliamentarians of the signatory states, to settle complex issues both globally and regionally, and to generate open discussions and reach consensus.

Today countless complicated issues still exist in many corners of the world. This calls for improved coherence and communication among the international organizations, the furthering of close cooperations, and the necessity to comply with decisions and recommendations.

The theme of this Autumn meeting is "addressing security challenges in the OSCE region and beyond: the role of parliamentarians in fostering regional cooperation." Over the course of two days, we, therefore, plan to discuss regional security, terrorism, human trafficking, regional economic challenges, food security, disaster risk reduction, human rights, freedom of press, religious and gender equality, and many other important issues.

Honorable parliamentarians, the representatives of your people, I have full confidence in you all to reach a common consensus through thorough discussions and multiple approaches to the given issues.

Finally, I like to note that this Autumn meeting is coinciding with the

widely celebrated commemoration of the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Mongolia's first democratic election, which led to the establishment of a permanent parliamentary system. By ensuring universal suffrage to its citizens in a short span of time, Mongolia now walks alongside countries with years of democratic election history and experience. It is a privilege to state that the parliamentary democracy has taken firm root in Mongolia.

This achievement was, in part, the result of the contribution made by the parliaments of many OSCE countries and their members of parliament.

Once again, I express my sincere gratitude for your kind acceptance of our invitation, wish you a very pleasant stay in our beautiful country, and wish you the best success during the Autumn meeting.
